Let your child lead.	 18 Read five books together today.	 19 Draw a picture inspired by one of the books that you read yesterday.	 20 Talk together about what sort of reading you most like to do. Books, magazines, etc.
 21 Encourage your child to "read" a book to you.	 22 Screen blackout day! Read books, go on an outing, or play games together.	 23 Practice writing some words together. Make up some silly words too!	 24 Recite some rhymes together today.	 25 Talk together with your child about the place where you grew up.	 26 Encourage your child to choose some songs and sing them together.	27 Visit the Library together
 28 Make a list of your favorite foods.	 29 Look at the label on a food package. Talk about what the label means and why it's there..	 30 Play a card or board game with your child.	 31 Ask your child what their favorite activity was this month and why.
