## Eatonville Pierce County Library's technology services closed Thursday, July 15

**PIERCE COUNTY, Washington** – Eatonville Pierce County Library's [technology services](#) will be closed **Thursday, July 15**, to prepare to open the building with more services starting **Friday, July 16**. On July 15, people may continue to pick up books, movies and other materials [curbside](#) at the library.

When Eatonville Library reopens on July 16, people may come into the building to browse bookshelves, check out books and movies and access technology including using computers, printers and Wi-Fi, as well as scanning, copying and faxing a limited number of pages free. Seating will be limited and will mostly be available for people to use technology services, such as computers.

Throughout the summer, the Pierce County Library System plans to open 18 of its 20 locations for browsing services. The Library System will continue to offer curbside pickup of books, movies and other items at 19 Pierce County locations.

The nationally acclaimed [Pierce County Library System](#) serves 620,000 people throughout Pierce County with 20 libraries and online services. The system is the fourth largest in the state and is funded primarily through property taxes. People may choose from 822,000 books, movies and other materials.
