Plant some seeds together.</p>	 <p>7</p> <p>Screen blackout day! Read books, go on an outing, or play games together.</p>
 <p>8</p> <p>Show your child a manual for something and talk together about how and why we use manuals.</p>	<p>Math</p> <p>9</p> <p>How many different shapes can you find in your living room.</p>	 <p>10</p> <p>Sing "The Wheels on the Bus" song together. (You can find the song online or on a CD at the Library)</p>	 <p>11</p> <p>Read a recipe with your child and talk about the value of recipes and how we use (or don't use!) them.</p>	 <p>12</p> <p>Play outside for at least some portion of today. Rain or shine!</p>	 <p>13</p> <p>Find a rhyming word for the name of each person in your family. (nonsense words are fun!)</p>	<p>14</p> <p>Visit the Library together</p>
 <p>15</p> <p>Sing and dance together. Use scarves or ribbons for added fun.</p>	 <p>16</p> <p>Hide an object somewhere in your home and draw a map to guide your child to the object's hiding place.</p>	 <p>17</p> <p>After reading a book together, talk to your child about it. Was it funny? Silly? Informative? Etc.</p>	 <p>18</p> <p>Using blankets, pillows, chairs etc. Create an obstacle course in a room in your home. Play on it together.</p>	 <p>19</p> <p>Talk with your child about a teacher that you had when you were young.</p>	 <p>20</p> <p>Together, write love notes for family members.</p>	 <p>21</p> <p>Encourage your child to talk about one of their friends—what do they like about them? Etc.</p>
 <p>22</p> <p>Create an outdoor game of some sort together. Hunt for bugs or pretend to be explorers.</p>	 <p>23</p> <p>Screen blackout day! Read books, go on an outing, or play games together.</p>	 <p>24</p> <p>Talk together about fears—why we have them, how we can face or cope with them etc.</p>	 <p>25</p> <p>Check out a Children's CD from the library or play some music online.</p>	<p>Math</p> <p>26</p> <p>Roll dice and count the rolled numbers together.</p>	 <p>27</p> <p>Spend 20 minutes of wildly happy reading together today.</p>	<p>28</p> <p>Visit the Library together</p>
