

### Ideas & Tips

- Play peek-a-boo with a scarf, blanket or towel.
- Play with a ball. Practice rolling it, dropping it, or bouncing it.
- Play a game of "I Spy" when you're out with your baby, to introduce new words.
- Your local library's baby story times feature books, movement activities and play time. Introduce your baby to new playmates: other babies and toddlers!
